Spotlight on Deacons' Ministries

Hurricane Season 2020

The Hurricane Ministry of our church's Board of Deacons assists members in need of temporary housing during hurricanes or severe tropical storms. If you are in need of emergency housing during or after a storm – or if you are able to share your home with members-in-need – please contact Eleanor Cicerchi at ecicerchi@gmail.com or 607-382-1781. You may also contact the Rev. Paul Means at 727-796-8090 or communications@northwoodpc.org.

When calling to ask for emergency housing, please provide your **name, best contact information, number of people needing accommodation, the number and type of pets you have, and any special needs.** If emailing to offer housing, please use the subject "Hurricane Volunteer" and include your name, address, phone number, email address, number of people you can accommodate and whether you have pets or can accept them. If you know your evacuation zone, please include that.

Note that the Pinellas County Department of Health maintains a **special needs evacuation database** of people who are mobility or otherwise impaired and may need assistance during a hurricane. Local fire/rescue departments call people on that list before an emergency and assist with evacuation. To put your name or that of a family member on the list, call 727-784-8668.

This year, because of the pandemic, the Pinellas County Office of Emergency Management will have more than 100 emergency shelters in North Pinellas, instead of the usual four. Your local fire/rescue department can help you find a shelter if that is needed.

Finally, the best advice for all of us is to be prepared. One helpful resource is baynews9.com. Click on "Weather, then "Hurricane Center," to find weather advisories, maps of evacuation zones and routes, and checklists for your family and pets.

Guidelines for Returning to Public Worship

The following guidelines, in careful coordination with PCUSA guidelines, government authorities, and medical experts, are recommended for implementation to resume Sunday in-person worship. Early stage participation is recommended specifically for healthy individuals with no underlying conditions. Vulnerable persons, as defined by the CDC, are encouraged to stay home. Opening is not recommended unless there is a 14-day reduction in the prevalence of COVID-19 as measured by such factors as: the number of new cases in Pinellas and Hillsborough counties; the percentage of positive test results in those counties; and other factors that the Session determines to be relevant.

- Hold a contemporary service at 9 am and a traditional service at 11 am.
- Limit the number of people allowed in the sanctuary for worship to 50.
- Have a plan in place for overflow seating in the Christian Education Building if the sanctuary attendance reaches 50.
- Document all persons present at each service so contact tracing can be done if someone attending tests positive for COVID-19 following the service.
- Continue online livestream worship for a 9 am contemporary and one traditional service at 11 am for those who choose to remain home until the risk is less or there is a vaccine.
- Greeters will open the East and South exterior building doors before services begin and close them after services start. Discourage use of other entry doors.
- Ushers will open the sanctuary doors before and after the services to minimize public contact of building surfaces.
- Hand sanitizer stations will be located near entrances. Provide signage to promote public use to clean hands before and after services.
- Bulletins will be placed on tables along with hand sanitizer near sanctuary double door entrances. Printable bulletins that can be brought to services will be available online.
- Promote and encourage physical distancing for worshipers via signage, announcements, and publications to avoid congregating in the building hallways before and after services.
- No passing of the peace. Handshakes and hugs should be avoided for now.
- No coffee, food, or fellowship time.
- No childcare or nursery will be provided. Children are welcome to worship together with their family.
- Face mask or cloth face coverings are required to be worn inside the building at all times. Those leading the service will wear a face mask when they are not speaking or singing. Disposable face masks will be available to those that request them.
- The Usher team will communicate and guide worshipers to maintain physical distancing when sitting for services in the sanctuary. Two different colored tapes will be placed on the ends of alternating pews in the sanctuary. Each service will use a specific color for seating so no pew will be used twice for seating on any particular Sunday.
- Bibles, hymnals, paper and pencils will be removed from the pews. No attendance forms will need to be completed. Will encourage worshipers to bring their Bibles from home.
- The congregation will be asked to abstain from singing and may hum softly through their mask.
- On Communion Sundays, individual pre-packaged kits will be utilized. Instructions for use will scroll on the overhead screen before service. Waste baskets will be available near the sanctuary exits to collect used items following the service.
- Offering plates/boxes will be placed near each of the sanctuary double doors to collect offerings.
- After conclusion of the service, Ushers will assist in directing worshipers to leave the sanctuary and church building maintaining physical distancing.
- Communicate that any congregating should take place outside the church building away from entrances following services, continuing to maintain physical distancing.
- The sanctuary and common touch areas in the building will be sanitized between services.

Beth-El Shoe Drive

Due to the current COVID-19 pandemic the annual August shoe drive for the Beth-El migrant farm workers is going to take place differently this year. The executive director at Beth-El has requested that in order to keep everyone safe, only monetary donations will be accepted. Beth-El will order the shoes directly from Amazon and then distribute them to the migrant farm workers. If you are giving online, please follow the prompts and select Beth-El Mission. Checks should be



sent to the church earmarked for the shoe drive as donations will be accepted through September 6th. Thank you Northwood for your continued generosity!!
