
HYMN NOTES: "Christ Is Alive!" (246)

This text by Brian Wren was written in 1968 with some revisions of stanzas 3 and 5 later. It was written for the Easter worship of Wren's congregation that was just ten days after the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The hymn pictures the resurrected Christ as deeply involved in the life and pain of humanity and not remote from us. Wren has been called the most successful English hymn writer since Charles Wesley. For more than four decades now, this hymn text has undergone changes (with the author's blessing) that show both the maturing and accommodation of hymn writing to be inclusive in regard to people. It also reflects the beginnings of a concern in the USA for the nonsexist rendering of forms of address and metaphors for deity.
