The rose on the baptismal font is in honor of Carley Lynn Lumia, infant daughter of Chris and Taryn Lumia. Carley was born on Thursday, February 23 weighing 7 lbs, 3 oz and 20 inches long.

Music Notes

In October of 1791, Mozart's *Concerto for Clarinet in A Major* received its premiere performance by the famous clarinetist Anton Stadler. It was one of Mozart's final works, and was his final purely instrumental work. He died only two months later while working on his *Requiem*. The Concerto was written for a little known instrument called the basset clarinet which had a range four notes lower than the standard clarinet. Even in Mozart's day, the basset clarinet was a rare, custom made instrument, so when the piece was published posthumously, a new version was arranged with the low notes transposed to regular range. You may recognize the second movement (heard today during communion) used in the movie *Out of Africa*. Heather Wood is a ninth grade student at Sickles High School in Tampa and recently performed this piece at the District Solo and Ensemble Music Performance Assessment for which she received a "superior" rating.

Affirmation of Faith

Our affirmation of faith today is from *The Heidelberg Catechism*. This confession of the Reformed Church was developed in Germany in the mid 1500s. Over the past several centuries it has been used by many Christian churches to explain and affirm our belief in some of the key doctrines revealed in the Bible.
