Bill Lewis, Air Force

Bill was commissioned as Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force in 1954 entering active service in 1955 at Keesler AFB, MS. He become squadron adjutant and later the commander of a six hundred man student squadron. In 1958 he was assigned as commander of the air traffic control facilities at both Kunsan and Kimpo Air Bases, Korea. Bill served as an air traffic control supervisor at Itazuke AB (Fukuoka), Japan and later assumed duties as staff officer, Headquarters, Far East Airways and Air Communications Command, Tokyo, Japan. Following active duty he served as Senior Admission Liaison Officer for the U.S. Air Force Academy, CO. He retired as a Lt. Colonel in August 1982.

Jim Youngblood, Army

Jim retired from the Army in 2004 as Chief Warrant Officer Three, having served for 20 years as an intelligence officer. Jim assumed duties as the Senior Defense Intelligence Analyst for U.S. Special Operations Command in August 2009. He serves as the principal advisor to the Director of Intelligence and Joint Intelligence Center for SOCOM on intelligence analysis and production in support of U.S. Special Operations Command. He is the senior mentor for intelligence analysts in the Special Operations Forces intelligence enterprise.

Building Renovations Approved

The Session has approved a Capital Campaign for needed renovations to the restrooms in the main building of our church. These renovation plans were the result of the 2010 Vision Task Force from two years of prayer, discernment and seeking input from the congregation and its leaders about ministry needs at Northwood. While these renovations will not begin until the summer of 2015, members of the congregation will receive a letter inviting them to make a pledge to the campaign in the coming month. These renovations, the first in nearly 35 years, will bring our restrooms up to required codes for both the school and church. It is envisioned that those making pledges toward the building campaign, over and above regular financial gifts to the church budget, will be asked to complete their pledge in no more than 18 months by December 2015 or before. A campaign letter and pledge card with more information about the project will be mailed to members in June. The Financial Goal of the Campaign is \$80,000.
