Music Notes:

Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory (354) by Julia Ward Howe, 1861

The author, Julia Ward Howe, was born in 1819 which means this year we celebrate the bicentennial of her birth. We have in our hymnal three of the five stanzas Howe scribbled down before dawn on November 19, 1861 in a Washington, DC hotel. She and her husband with some friends had come to see the Union troops on review near Falls Church, VA. On the slow road back to the hotel they sang army-related songs to pass the time since the marching troops and equipment shared the highway. Among these was "John Brown's Body" and she was challenged to come up with better words for that tune. There are many Biblical images included in her hymn but in addition to the Biblical images, the author was also dependent on the lyrics of "John Brown's Body" for some of her inspiration. That song ends each stanza with "but his soul goes marching on." This hymn has naturally been associated with funerals for national leaders beginning with Abraham Lincoln in 1865 and continuing through Ronald Reagan in 2004.


