Hymn Notes:

"Come, Ye Sinners, Poor and Needy (415)

From what I can tell, this hymn appears for the first time in a Presbyterian hymnal. The stanzas are by Joseph Hart in his Hymns Composed on Various Subjects, 1759 originally titled õCome, and welcome, to Jesus Christ.ö The London-born Hart struggled against God for years. When he attended church, he went to find fault. After he heard a sermon by John Wesley, he responded by writing a tract, oThe Unreasonableness of Religion.ö He was a language teacher by profession, but spiritually he was (in his own words) õa loose backslider, an audacious apostle, and a bold-faced rebel.ö At age 45 he wandered into a Moravian chapel in London and heard words of hope. Three years later, he became a minister and began writing hymns. The anonymous refrain with reference to the parable of the prodigal son was found in Southern hymnbooks as early as 1811.
