HYMN NOTES

"Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming (129)

This German carol dates at least to the 15th century but the earliest known copy of the text made in the 1580's comes from a manuscript prayer book found at St. Alban's monastery in Trier (Germany). That manuscript contains 19 stanzas with the likely intent of praising Mary drawing on the "Rose of Sharon" imagery. But it is unclear whether that first line was "ein Ros" (a rose) or "ein Reis" (a branch), strengthening the associations with the "rod" and "branch" of Jesse in Isaiah 11:1—today's lectionary scripture. That would also be more compatible with Protestant views. The music is the famous setting by Michael Praetorius from 1609.


