### MUSIC NOTES:

The Opening Voluntary is an arrangement for trumpet and organ of the opening movement of a large choral work by the 17<sup>th</sup> century French composer Marc Antoine Charpentier (1634-1704). Charpentier studied in Rome then returned to Paris as a royal court composer, eventually becoming music master at Saint Chapelle. The Te Deum is an ancient prayer still in regular use in Catholic, Lutheran, Anglican and Methodist churches, the name coming from the first line, “te Deum laudamus” (we praise You O God). The text follows the outline of the Apostles’ Creed with some Psalm verses added at the end. After the rediscovery of Charpentier’s *Te Deum* in 1953 it has been used for nearly 60 years as the theme music for many broadcasts on the European Broadcasting Union making it Charpentier’s most recognized music.
