

HYMN NOTES:

“Lo, He Comes with Clouds Descending” (348)

This “second coming” hymn was written by Charles Wesley (1707-1788). He used the first line but completely recast the rest of a crude hymn by John Cennick (author of the famous “Wesley” table grace, “Be Present at Our Table, Lord”). The ideas and language are borrowed from the book of Revelation and based on Revelation 1:7, “Behold, he cometh with clouds, and every eye shall see him....” The language is apocalyptic and should be interpreted symbolically, not literally.

The tune, named HELMSLEY, is by Thomas Olivers (1725-1799) who adapted a melody he heard being whistled on the street. He was born in Wales and received little in the way of formal education. He spend his life’s vocation as a shoemaker, but after hearing a sermon of George Whitefield, he was led to join the Methodist Society and in 1753 became a traveling evangelist until his death. Olivers is buried in Wesley’s tomb at City Road Chapel cemetery.
