Dear Friends of Northwood.

Today, and for the coming months, I want to offer in our Window Newsletter a series of articles about the importance of Christian stewardship and key dates for our Annual Stewardship Campaign. It is our belief as Christians that God calls everyone to a life of service and generous giving. This is why each Fall, and at other times, we emphasize the importance of giving which includes the giving of our time, talents and treasure. As we enter this year's stewardship season, our theme will be "Opening the Door" which comes from Revelation 3:20, "Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in to you and eat with you, and you with me." Our Stewardship Team hopes that each one of us will open the doors of sharing our gifts more fully in ministry and mission in Christ's name this coming year.

The wonderful things Northwood does in the name of Jesus Christ are not accomplished without significant volunteer and financial commitments by so many of you. Thank you for your faithful giving this year thus far which has been at 95% of pledges made to date! This being said, our current budget and giving helps us to maintain existing programs but not grow ministries or increase giving to mission. In order to plan an effective budget for the coming year, we need everyone to turn in a pledge card. This request includes all those who have been confirmed as church members-all ages. While we experience generous giving at Northwood, over the past several years our record keepers tell me that we have a downward trend in the number of pledges made for each year. This is a national trend and is not unique to Northwood. Indeed we began this current year by adopting a deficit budget. As we each plan and consider our giving for the coming year I want to ask you to consider several ways of giving.

Pledge Envelopes: Personally, I grew up as many of you did learning the discipline of using the pledge envelope each week for my Sunday offering. I found great value in this as a young person for it helped me be accountable to God for my financial giving. I remember if I missed a Sunday of church the envelopes would remind me that I was behind in my giving by noting the dates of the unused envelope. As I began working as a teenager, my parents reminded me to tithe from my earnings and again the pledge/giving envelopes were a faithful reminder. Many people still enjoy giving with envelopes which are provided for the new year beginning in December at Northwood.


Online Giving: There are a growing number of people among us who give regularly to Northwood by utilizing our electronic online giving. During the upcoming stewardship season you will hear more and more about this increasingly popular way to give.






Fresh Brewed Woman's Bible Study
