From the PASTOR'S DESK Rev. E. Chris Curvin, Pastor

Dear Church Family and Friends of Northwood,

The 2013 year is well begun as I write this letter to you. The first month of this year will offer plenty of opportunities for us to enjoy many activities as a church family. Just this past weekend we already enjoyed the annual miracle of the church-wide garage sale and heard news of it's success because of so many who gave things they no longer needed and so many volunteers who organized and worked hard for the big sale on Saturday. Thank you! Programs and education classes have also begun and we have enjoyed meaningful and effective worship together. We warmly welcome back all our annual "snowbirds!" We are off to a strong start in 2013!

For those who don't know us, we are a Presbyterian church of just over 1,000 members, democratically organized to embrace the faith that is common to most Christians. As such we are a diverse body of Christians who seek to invite others to come and join our fellowship and celebrate our oneness in Jesus Christ. We gather each Sunday as well as other times to grow and learn from God's Word. Then, we prepare to follow Jesus' instruction to go in mission and service in His name... "Come, Grow, Go!" These three words continue to remind us of what we are about at Northwood.

On January 27th we will gather at Noon in the Sanctuary for our Annual Meeting which will be followed by a celebratory covered dish luncheon in the education building. On the cover of this newsletter you will see the basic agenda for our meeting which will also include the distribution of the annual report for the past year.

I want to briefly mention here the fourth key characteristic of the Natural Church Development (NCD) Model that we have been studying as we seek to continue to be a healthy and vital congregation. Thus far we have reviewed the first three characteristics: (1) Empowering Leadership (2) Gift-Based Ministry and (3) Passionate Spirituality. The fourth characteristic essential to the growth and health of a Christian congregation is "Effective Structures."

The research of the NCD model indicated that while some Christians, they name "spiritualists," are skeptical of organization and structures, organization which is effective and promotes an ongoing multiplication of ministry is a key factor in growing churches. A good illustration of this can be seen in looking at God's act of creation. There is an intimate connection between structure and life which was expressed first at creation. The act of creation was an act of forming and shaping. Whenever God breathes the Holy Spirit into formless clay, both life and form spring forth. A comparative creative act occurs wherever God pours out his Spirit within the church today - and thus giving it life, structure and form.

May God continue to breathe the Holy Spirit into the way we are democratically organized and utilize elected leaders to oversee the life of our congregation.
