We all know how difficult the economy has been the last few years but Northwood continues to be blessed by God's call on the lives of her members and friends. In spite of beginning 2012 with a deficit budget and pledge giving that fell short by \$20,000 over the twelve month period, generous non-pledge giving and expense control allowed us to finish the year with a surplus. The surplus was directed to replenish the Maintenance Reserves funds (almost to the dollar) that were used in December for the new Christian Education building roof. Northwood continues to be debt free and investments which have been flat since 2008 are once again beginning to generate a return.

As we ended the first quarter of this fiscal year in March, pledge giving was on target at 100% and expenses were only slightly over budget year-to-date. A new A/C unit for the Chancel was installed in February at a cost of about \$10,000 and was fully funded from the regular operating account. This was a significant single expense when compared to most items in the budget. We were fortunate to cover it without tapping into the Maintenance Reserves. In addition to the regular operating needs of the church, several special projects have been funded over the last couple of years. In 2011, our members gave nearly \$40,000 in over and above offerings to the Sound and Light Campaign for the Sanctuary. A bequest from the Clarence and Florence Wright Trust of slightly more than this amount provided the funds necessary to complete the project. In December of 2012 and in very short order, \$7,000 was given In Honor or In Memory of Loved Ones to provide new Presbyterian Hymnals for worship. Additionally in 2012, nearly \$70,000 in member-directed gifts, over and above those set aside through the annual budget, was sent to benevolent organizations both near and far. It is true and it is a blessing that when a need is identified, the Northwood congregation steps up in response to all that God has done and is doing in the life of our church.

Loving Relationships The 8th Key Characteristic (A series of articles on the 8 Key Characteristics of the Natural Church Development (NCD) Model for Church Growth and Being a Healthy Church.) Dear Friends,

I have been writing some time now on the eight key characteristics of the NCD model of church growth. This article focuses on the last important characteristic for church growth: Loving Relationships! This was Northwood's highest score of the eight characteristics surveyed!

I don't know what you think about the term "loving relationships," but one thing is clear from the study of churches around the world: "Growing churches manifest a measurably higher 'love quotient' than stagnant or declining churches." As a church we work hard at reaching out by offering a class called "Discovering Northwood" to welcome new members. In a survey done just over a year ago of the 70+ churches in our presbytery, the Presbytery of Tampa Bay, Northwood was ranked the second highest in the number of new members received in one year. (If you find someone visiting, encourage them to attend these new member classes so we can get them involved, engaged, and nurtured in their faith!)

The term "love quotient" may not be an expression that people universally like, so let me explain what is meant by this phrase. The questionnaire that selected members of our congregation took contained a group of questions that allowed the study to "score us" on each characteristic. The questions asked in this characteristic, for example, were "How much time do members spend with one another outside of official church sponsored events?" "How often do they invite one another over for meals, dinner or social groups?" "How generous is the church in doling out compliments?" "To what extent is the pastor(s) aware of personal problems or health issues of members?" And finally the question, "How much laughter is there in the church?"

What were the results for Northwood? We scored very high on all these questions in the survey. Does this amaze you about your church? The truth of the matter is that the Natural Church Development Model correlates such practical understandings of love with a greater magnetic power of attracting people to Jesus Christ and His church than all the marketing efforts of the world. At best, marketing the church has been compared to artificial flowers. They may look deceptively real, but they have no fragrance. Real Christian love, however, spreads that mysterious scent that few can resist in becoming part of such a church family.

This story and I close. I was raised, as many of you know, in a small Presbyterian Church in Soddy-Daisy, Tennessee. I have often felt that it was in that church that I was baptized in a pool of love. It was out of the congregation that I sensed God's strong call to the ministry of Jesus Christ. The people and the relationships there are still a vital part of my faith story even today.

I have found in ministry with you at Northwood, and in my experience of our church staff, that all are committed to being a church where loving relationships are highly valued and cherished. The relationships made and nurtured here and the faith journey shared together with Christian friends is key in our efforts to attract others to become part of the Christian community.

One of the most significant things I have come to learn and enjoy about Northwood first hand is that we are indeed a church filled with laughter and loving relationships! Interestingly, in churches with 1,000 or more members that took the NCD survey, the characteristic of "loving relationships" was the most frequent minimum score.

All of this reminds me of one of the important reasons people should seek membership in a local church. By joining a church as a member we experience the joy of serving alongside others. The fruit of the Spirit is primarily manifested in our relationships with others (Gal 5:22-23). God never intended for us to live our lives independent of others, or "above" them.

How we should all hope that when God calls us to serve Him we do so by being part of a group of loving Christians, who help us find where our great joy meets the world's great need.
