

#### We Have A New Tree!

Some of you noticed the dead tree on the pre-school playground. We had been watching it for more than a year with the hope that the downward trend it appeared to be on would reverse itself. But as our winter began to turn to spring it was apparent that even the smallest sign of life was gone. Since licensing for the school requires a certain amount of shade, either another tree or something manmade was required. While the children were on Spring Break, March 24-28, the dead tree was removed, a hole was dug and a new 24 foot, 10 inch caliper tree with a fourteen foot spread was planted. The entire process was fun to watch with special equipment being brought on campus for each of the steps. Now the time of care and nurturing for the tree that started at the nursery will be continued with us. Be sure you take a look at our beautiful new tree when you pass by the playground. # From the PASTOR'S DESK

"The Castaway Palms"

Dear Members and Friends of Northwood,

I write this letter to you after having just returned home this Palm Sunday from a full day of three morning worship services and a wonderful afternoon Lenten Cantata. (By the time you receive this letter, the worship we enjoyed during Holy Week and Easter will be over.) However, today was a wonderful Sunday of worship at Northwood in which palm branches were waved to welcome Jesus Christ as Lord and King of our lives!

Let me first say a good word about the cantata. The interaction of the cantata's drama, lighting, narration, nails, instruments, organ, and the choir under the leadership of Stephanie Carson and Tom Huffman was truly outstanding! So many people said to me how beautiful the cantata was this year, and it was beautiful.

The Palm Sunday Cantata, the Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services as well as Easter worship always remind me of how music is such a gracious gift of God. Both traditional and contemporary music helps us to express the inexpressible; it lifts our spirits when our spirits need lifting; it strengthens faith and most of all enables us to give glory to God for what God has done for us in Jesus Christ.

I'm especially reminded that the music we hear and sing at Easter helps us to meet the highest and deepest in our lives, namely God and God's promises. The music of the hymn, song or anthem combined with instrumental music and drama are "signing points" beyond themselves to the One we have come to honor and praise.


Music certainly helps us to express what we cannot express with words alone. I'm mindful every Sunday of this as I know people bring with them sorrows as well as joys to worship. I often hear from those leaving on Sunday saying worship helped them to be re-charged for what they face ahead. I hear almost every Sunday someone say, "This is just what I needed!" Worship and Music is such a gift from God.

With all this said, I remember leaving church tonight after such a full day and there on the ground lay Sunday's palm branches. The castaway palm branches tell us that worship and praise and parades can become, if we are not careful, only frivolous moments; matters of habit only. Some years ago a man I met on a trip said to me, "Pastor, you religious people worship Jesus, but I don't often see that loyalty in the world of business where I live." I agreed with him that sometimes we honor Christ as our King with our lips but not with our lives. When that happens our praise to Him becomes like castaway branches, ground under foot.

One of the challenging words which Jesus said was this, "Not everyone who says, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom." That should strike at our hearts on Palm Sunday and our Easter celebrations. The castaway palms remind us that some people come to cheer Jesus only on special occasions, the up-times like Easter, but they don't honor our Lord as King during the ordinary times of the year.

As you come to worship now after Easter I encourage you to note the birthdays listed in the bulletin. If it has been a while since you have seen or spoken to someone on the list, give them a call and let them know that you have missed seeing them in worship. Worship is God's gracious gift to us and we don't want anyone to miss out on this great gift! And all God's people said, "Amen!"
