At the beginning of every school year, I receive a list of seven high-quality children's anthems from the Central Florida chapter of the Chorister's Guild. Reflections on Building Renovations, Our Vision and Our Values

Dear Friends.

Thank you to those who have already spoken to me about the announcement I made in worship on May 18th regarding the building renovations recently approved by the Session. There has been no surprise at this need and I've heard many say it's "long overdue."

There were a few questions I received which I want to answer here for all of us. To begin with, "What went into the decision to renovate the restrooms in the main building of the church?" The decision to renovate the main restrooms of the church came out of the good and faithful work by our Vision Task Force which met beginning in 2010 for almost two years. The Task Force held in-depth discussions with church staff, ministry teams, technology representatives and an architect to identify current and future needs of our church campus. They took time to walk through our campus buildings to look at how programs and activities utilize existing space and what changes would benefit the church in the future. Finally after much prayer and discernment we realized that one of the main priorities we needed to address now are required upgrades to our main restrooms.

Our restrooms are located in the heart of activity next to the sanctuary, Pre-School, kitchen and education rooms They are outdated, not up to multiple required codes, not handicap accessible, and, as you may notice, they also look like they needed renovating years ago! It was unanimously agreed upon that these restrooms must be renovated for the growth and vitality of Northwood.

Another good question was whether the \$80,000 campaign goal would be enough to satisfy the kind of expense associated with today's construction costs. We believe that through initial estimates we can do an effective renovation based on current material costs and the square footage of the project.

We have already greatly benefitted from the expertise of one our members, an architect, Lex Long, who has his own architectural firm, Long & Associates. All of Lex's time and efforts have been donated toward the project. Thank you Lex! Please note that if you have questions about the project, please limit your questions to either, Elder Lou Weislogal (Stewardship, Finance and Property Chair), Chris Hurst (Business Administrator), or to me. In other words, please allow Lex and Melissa Long and family to enjoy worship on Sunday and let his gift be his gift to us.

When will the renovation begin?

The renovations will begin as close to June 1, 2015 as possible when the Pre-School will be on summer break and our peak time of active programs and attendance won't be disrupted by the temporary closure. The restrooms in the Church Office and in the Family Life Center, and perhaps some portable restrooms, will be available. We sincerely hope and pray that beginning this July members will make an 18 month pledge or a significant gift toward the renovation campaign. Pledges are asked to be completed by December 2015 or earlier. Thus we will plan to begin next summer with most of the funds needed already in hand.

As we reflect on our church's vision and values, two of the most important values we hold dear as the Church of Jesus Christ are people and buildings. I've always heard that the way a church cares for its buildings and campus says volumes about how we care for people. When people visit Northwood looking for a church home or a Pre-School for their children, one of the first things they see is how we care for our buildings. It's also good stewardship to maintain the church for future generations so that we pass on to them the Church of Jesus Christ in even better condition than when it was inherited.

The next letter you receive in mid-June about these renovations will include a pledge card and will ask, "At what level of giving is God calling you to participate?" Your pledge contributions to "Building Renovations for the Future" will be greatly appreciated.
