



# 2014 Advent Devotion

It's almost Christmas in July and we are working ahead to prepare Advent Devotional for the 2014 Advent Season. That means we are looking for about thirteen members of Northwood who would like to participate in this new seasonal tradition. Below are a few questions that have been asked which will hopefully help you decide whether or not you are interested in participating:

# Q:How does this work?

A: I will provide you with one reading for a specific day for you to provide a devotional based on that reading and/or the season itself. These devotions can be personal reflections or something you've learned or heard over the years. Make it your own! Please do not copy something from a book. You may quote small phrases, but please reference the quotes.

# Q: How long does it have to be and how does the editing process work?

A: It should be right around 150 words, give or take 25. Any shorter and we may add to it, any longer and we may edit some out. This is only because we are working with limited space, as I'm sure you can imagine. Ultimately I reserve the right to edit any submission for content and length, but do my best to stay true to what is written. A draft of the final devotion will be sent back to the person who submitted it to read before printing.

# Q: How much time do I have to write this?

A: The sooner you sign up, the more time you have. All drafted devotions will be due July 21st.

# Q: Do you have an example of what to write?

A: Copies of the 2013 Advent Devotional and 2014 Lenten Devotional are available in the church office. Stop by to pick up a copy.

### **Q:** Is there an age limit?

A: Absolutely not! This year we have opened this up to children, youth and adults!
